This book is the work of 27 contributors work-  
ing under the leadership of Sir Ernest Barker.  
It is designed to continue and fulfil the policy  
by which the Oxford University Press has  
already published works on Shakespeare's Eng-  
land, Johnson's England and Early Victorian  
England; but it has the wider and deeper pur-  
pose of giving a view of the general character  
of England, not so much at a point of time  
(though the present naturally occupies the fore-  
ground of the picture), as in the whole course  
of its long-term and permanent operations.  
Due weight has, therefore, been given to the  
living past, and, while the theme is the char-  
acter and spirit of contemporary England, history  
and antiquity have also entered, not for  
their own sake, but as explaining the present.

The illustrations have been chosen by Dr. John  
Johnson. They do more than merely decorate  
the text: they are its complement.
